PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

Co that was 2022, and in my opinion, the hardest of all three COVID effected years. I was optimistic when the government announced that we would not be going into lockdown again, and that we would manage life with precautions. It turns out that was harder on everyone. It seems like staff, students and parents were all catching COVID or isolating at different points across the year. Each week brought a different group of students and staff that were out of school at different times, only to be pick up a cold or flu and be out of school again. It was really challenging and forced us to take unusual measures like the rostering home of year levels. I remember in Term 1 when we had our first COVID case and we were required to do contact tracing. I was ringing families to find out how they were doing and if they needed any assistance for the 14-day isolation period. That extra little part time job grew as COVID entered our community and we tried to keep students on track with their learning. When you pause to think of the scale and duration of this unprecedented disruption across the year it truly is remarkable what we have been able to achieve in 2022. In this yearbook you will see many Arts and Sports groups, school trips, academic success, house events, fundraising, community work and even the creation of new events such as the Battle of Schools (a Waipawide competition for juniors run entirely by senior students) all achieved under the pressure that came with 2022.

It is incredible and I want thank all our staff and students for working so hard to make this year a success. It has been difficult, and I think that we will continue to see the impacts of COVID over the coming years in areas we may not have anticipated. As a nation, we have kept a close eye on the physical risk and protected ourselves well against this. As a community, we now need to keep an eye on the other social risks that are starting to emerge that are connected to the range of difficulties we have all experienced over the past three years. The impact of the last three years could be seen and felt for a while yet in different ways, both expected and unanticipated. As an example, we have seen changes (both positive and negative) in student motivation, engagement and behaviour that show that this time managing the pandemic has impacted us all in different ways. I am fortunate in my role to witness how much support has been offered to those in need in our community, and a lot of us have needed support in all forms.



Across the year I have seen staff, students and whaanau go the extra distance to help others in our community. Whether that has been financially, through volunteer work, through pouring energy into coaching or managing teams, or through just treating each other with kindness.

It has all made a difference to how people have felt about the year and, ultimately, how we have managed to survive it. We have all been stretched and challenged through this pandemic and this year has been particularly taxing. We are probably all sick of anything associated with that disease and feel tired and grumpy after the past few years have left us drained. We are no longer under direct threat from the pandemic, but it may take us a while longer yet to recover fully. Now that we have drawn a line under the time that was COVID, we have an opportunity to step back from the immediate challenges we have faced and collectively look to support and guide our youth in this transition away from a COVID dominated world. The way we manage this transition will reflect on the wonderful community of which we are all proud to be a part. There will be some challenges in this recovery, but through this time we have the opportunity to show care for ourselves and others, treating each other with kindness and looking for ways we can continue to offer support and encouragement. However, before we look to help others, we need to take good care of ourselves. Make sure that you find some time to re-charge and unwind this summer. Re-connect with your loved ones and put time into strengthening these relationships again. Find the things that you know make you stronger and happier and set aside time to do more of them. The year has demanded much from us so please, make sure you put back into yourself and recharge with a seriously well-earned break.

LIBRARY


The year started with the winner of the Jaime Moore Memorial Cup Services to the Library 2021 Cup winner Sam Kingston as our Head Boy for 2022.

To make six "A" finals and seven "B" finals at the New Zealand Secondary Schools Rowing Champs (the Maadi Cup) on the back of only two lead-up regattas was a fantastic achievement and testament to how hard the team and our athletes worked throughout the season. CHS finished 8th from 52 schools at North Island Secondary Schools Championships and 11th out of 97 schools at Maadi Cup. Thank you to all our coaching team for your own personal sacrifices to coach our athletes this season, it can't have been easy without regattas going ahead and so much uncertainty.

Rowing once again benefitted from the generosity and support of local businesses this season. In particular, Cambridge Real Estate and David Soar maintained their relationship with us as our major sponsor. It was great to see our Maadi athletes and coaches wearing the Cambridge Real Estate sponsored Maadi Gear with pride.

With such a compressed season, medals were at a premium. At the North Island Secondary Schools Championships, our boys performed well under the challenging circumstances of a heavily regulated regatta. The girls' crews proved to be more successful, scooping seven medals including two golds.

For several weeks it was unclear if the time-honoured Maadi Cup regatta would proceed, with Covid regulations changing frequently. Once confirmed, only Under 16s and over were permitted to attend, and off to Twizel our excited rowers went.

The Maadi Cup remains one of the marquee events across all of New Zealand Secondary School sport. Through strong teamwork and dedication our squad produced two gold medals and a significant number of promising performances beyond that. Particular congratulations to Isabel Murray and Lucy Eastwood for their win in the Girls Under 16 Girls double sculls, and to the Girls Under 16 Coxed Quadruple Sculls crew (Lauren Wood, Libby Tonks, Tegan O'Dywer, Lucy Eastwood, and Isabel Oxenham (Cox)) for matching their success.

Many throughout the squad will have benefitted enormously from their first South Island regatta, and this bodes well for upcoming seasons.




MATHS

It has been another phenomenal year for problem-solving in the Mathematics Faculty. We competed in four competitions; had the privilege to take part in the NCEA Numeracy Pilot - an exciting new assessment to be implemented in the new curriculum - and were blown away with yet another successful year in the classroom.

Our first competition was the Kiwi Math's Competition, which was highly contested by over 16,000 students from over 450 schools. From the 24 CHS students who participated in this challenge, we would like to congratulate Hunter Davis and Max Frith, who placed in the top 25% and received a certificate of Merit. Our next competition was held by Education Perfect, where the students from Cambridge High School answered 49,361 questions and earned 31,609 points after spending 373 hours on EP. A special congratulations shout to Millie Sansom and Liam Dobson who received a gold certificate.





Our participation continued with 32 students who engaged in the 30-problem Australian Mathematics Competition in term three. In this competition, an exceptional achievement was gained by Max Frith and Aidan Dobson who received a Distinction for placing in the top 20%. This is truly outstanding! The last competition for 2022 was the WaiMaths, held at Melville High School. This is a competition where the students need to solve as many problems as possible in a given time. With schools from Te Awamutu, Hamilton, and Cambridge competing against each other, our warmest congratulations to our Year 9 team - Max Firth, Hunter Davis, and Georgia Bertrand - who placed in the top 5.

We are truly proud of each student who gave their best in each competition, practical activity, and assessment this year. We wish you the best for the rest of the year and can't wait to welcome you back to class in 2023.

SCIENCE

2022 has seen a return to some normalcy, avoiding lengthy lockdowns, but with many students still learning from home as the full impact of Covid 19 was felt in our community. Science teaching and learning progressed but many field trips in the earlier part of the year were unfortunately cancelled. Science students persevered with the learning opportunities that were provided and engaged with blended e-learning courses when forced to stay home.

Luckily some of our field trips were able to go ahead. Year 9s carried out community work, planting trees to help to improve the ecology of some of our local waterways. Our regularly programmed Year 10 trip to Owl Farm also went ahead, with all Year 10s getting to experience the wide range of career pathways connected to our agricultural sector, along with some of the emerging technologies being trialed in the sector. This was all made possible by the Smart Waikato Secondary Schools Employment Partnerships programme.

One of our senior Physics students, Anna Jago, has shared her thoughts about her experiences this year... "Physics, the most interesting and entertaining of all the sciences at Cambridge high school, has had yet another exciting year in 2022. From experiments in the classroom, to vortex on the field, even all the way to Auckland to experience physics in action, we have done and learnt it all. The highlight of the year for our level three physics students was definitely our trip to rainbows end during term 2. This trip allowed us to feel the effects of rotational motion, specifically on the stratosfear, and understand the concepts learnt in the classroom in a real-life context. It also promised a fun day out".

2022 saw some of our previous science students awarded high levels of achievement in Level 3 Scholarship Exams and the creation of a new general science pathway at Cambridge High. Students in Level 2 general science carried out practical work into bottle rocket design, experiments in plant growth and developing their expertise with microscopes. In 2023 we will offer the Level 3 version of this course, offering learning across the science disciplines within a UE approved subject and with a focus on practical science.

SSEP

2022 has seen a continuation of the Secondary School Employment Partnership programme (SSEP). This is a Smart Waikato initiative that brings schools and local businesses together.

This year 14 Year 10 science classes visited Owl Farm and enjoyed presentations from Westpac Bank, Fonterra, Cambridge Veterinary Services, and Halter Technologies. Jo Sheridan, the demonstration manager at Owl Farm, was not only key in organizing the day, but also gave a fascinating presentation to all of the groups about pasture. A highlight for many was seeing the number and size of the worms that were beneath their feet. There was something for everyone; including several wonderful dramatic performances of students

























acting out how cattle respond to Halters' innovative tech for managing dairy herds. Westpac got the \$ signs showing in several students eyes when they calculated the value of a farm and dairy herd. Other students were fascinated with Frankie the friendly cow, who ably assisted them learning more about animal health from Peter Briston of Cambridge Veterinary Services. Fonterra satisfied a thirst for insight into the technology employed in the logistics of collecting and processing millions of litres of milk and then also sweetened the day even further with yummy flavoured milk.

This event has run for several years and could not go ahead without local dairy farmer, Markus Woutersen.









YEAR 9 TREE PLANTING

On Friday the 13th of May four Year 9 classes headed out to a property in Maungatautari to help regenerate a local stream with native plantings. They were accompanied by their science teachers and a group of keen Year 13 environmental committee members.

The plants had been provided by the Trees for Survival Trust and raised from seedlings here at Cambridge High School by Meshy Holden and a group of dedicated Homeroom students. The students worked in two groups across the day to plant over 700 plants in total. This massive effort will have a positive impact on the health of the local stream and ultimately Lake Karapiro where the stream joins the Waikato River.

Planting along waterways improves water quality by:

- Stabilising stream banks to improve water clarity
- ☐ Increasing shade to reduce water temperature and increase dissolved oxygen levels
- Filtering nutrients out of ground water and runoff before it reachs waterways

The Year 9 students were able to link their planting efforts to the environmental science work they had covered in their science classes. They all had an opportunity to take a break from the planting and go through some of the measures used to assess water quality, and to explore what animal life was present in the stream they were planting along. The range and abundance of invertebrate life was a great sign that the stream was already in good health. Amongst the finds were mayfly, stoneflies, freshwater snails, caddis larvae, and Dobson fly. Students were astounded how much life was in the stream and they were proud to know their efforts would help maintain the water quality into the future.

A great sign of the biodiversity that these efforts support was the pair of $k\bar{a}k\bar{a}$ that come to circle overhead and check out the plants that will add to the natural environment as they mature.

Huge thanks go out to the Risi family for allowing us to come and explore their stream and add to the native plantings in the Maungatautari area. We had a great time.





































CAREERS/GATEWAY











































































GEOGRAPHY
